ASVAB to be offered in February

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) will be administered on Thursday, February 6, 2025. Students in grades 10-12 are eligible to take the ASVAB. The ASVAB is a multiple-aptitude battery that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. It is administered annually to more than one million military applicants, high school and post-secondary students. The ASVAB can also be used for career exploration purposes for students who are unsure of what career path they might be interested in pursuing. If you are interested in taking the ASVAB, please sign up in the School Counseling office by January 22.
