

BOCES Opportunities for Students

The Addison students have an opportunity to attend the GST BOCES Cooper's campus in their junior and senior years. It gives kids chances to participate in hands-on activities, instead of sitting in a traditional classroom all day. There are many different CTE programs they can choose to study: Animal Science, Automotive Technology, Building Construction, CISCO Networking Academy, Collison Repair & Refinishing Tech, Cosmetology, Criminal Justice, Culinary Arts, Digital Media Arts, Heavy Equipment, Nurse Assisting, and Welding & Machine Trades. With these trades, students usually do not have to take a math or science class during their junior or senior year, and they may not be required to take an English class their senior year as it is taught in their trade. "The work in my trade can be challenging sometimes, but at the end of the day, I know it's all going to be worth it," said a junior in the Cosmetology program.

By attending BOCES, there are endless opportunities for the students. Even some employers hire students who are still in their CTE programs. Students also have a career option as soon as they graduate and can go to college with the credits. They work hard to learn more about their field. One of the high school counselors stated, "I am a huge supporter of students attending vocational



BOCES provides a hands-on component that a lot of students really enjoy. "Many of our students who attend BOCES become more successful in their classes at Addison [High School] because they are starting to experience a lot of success in their vocational program and it translates across all the work that they are doing" said Mrs. M. Clark, high school counselor. BOCES is a phenomenal option for students that excel and benefit from hands-on work, which is not offered in traditional school. A senior who takes building trades said, "It helped me find something I'm good at and [is] helping me find what I wanted to do with my future." 





The Life Skills class also welcomed a Sergeant from the National Guard.


