Tuscarora Elementary Educational Experiences





Perry Ground, Onondaga Nation, visits MS and HS History Classes

Perry Ground is a Turtle Clan member of the Onondaga Nation and has been telling stories for more than 25 years as a way of educating people about the culture, beliefs and history of the Haudenosaunee (sometimes known as Iroquois) Confederacy. Perry shares his stories in a very energetic, fun, and engaging style and makes the audience part of the story experience. Also an accomplished educator, Perry has worked with students from Pre-K through college. The classroom programs that Perry offers are taught in the same engaging style and enhance each student's study of Native Peoples. Perry is available to visit schools, museums, libraries, festivals, and more to share stories and programs that will educate and entertain audiences of all ages. He presented a storytelling session to Mr. Shea's and Mr. VanWoert's History classes on Monday, May 12th. The presentation highlighted Women in the Haudenosaunee communities throughout history. Starting with the Creation Story and SkyWoman, the talk showed the important responsibilities woman have within the culture, government, and communities of the Haudenosaunee. Comparing these responsibilities and freedoms to those of American women, the role that Haudenosaunee woman played in influencing the ideas of early suffragists was discussed as well. The talk about discussed connections to modern traditions and issues.

The speaker presented traditional Haudenosaunee (Iroquois) legends that have been told for hundreds of years. These stories teach about the beliefs, customs, and history of the Haudenosaunee people. The presentation was very "interactive" as Perry included audience members in the stories and also used vivid descriptions to bring the story to life. Storytelling is an important part of traditional Haudenosaunee lifestyle. Students enjoyed this captivating and highly entertaining yet very educational experience.

PE Field Trip

The High School student PE classes were offered the opportunity to go on a Cooperative Skills field trip. This gave students a chance to go outside and collaborate with each other in various activities involving high and low elements. In the low elements, students had to rely on one another and focus on their communication skills. The skills that they learned from those were put to the test when students were given the option to go on higher elements. These abilities were important for everyone's safety and comfort.
