Second Step in the Middle School

As we continue to work through a post-pandemic life, it is more important than ever to focus on the social and emotional wellbeing of students. One of the strategies the middle school is utilizing to address this need and to improve skills is through The Second Step Program. This is a Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) curriculum that is research-based to help address and improve skills, such as the management of emotions, impulse control, problem solving and encouraging empathy. Middle School counselor, Mrs. VanSant states, "Second Step not only enhances a student's social-emotional skills but promotes prosocial behavior and academic achievement as well. There has also been evidence that this program contributes to the prevention of conduct problems, aggressive behavior, and emotional distress. The benefits of SEL go beyond school; they can extend into the

workforce by providing students with workforce readiness skills like critical thinking, cognitive flexibility, emotional intelligence and more."

The program was first introduced to the middle school during the 2021-22 school year. The curriculum consists of four units: Mindset and Goals, Recognizing Bullying and Harassment, Thoughts, Emotions and Decisions, and Managing Relationships and Social Conflict. These lessons are presented to all middle school students during their 9th period class time certain days of the month.

Mrs. Benton, Middle School Principal, supports the program in the quote: "Through the use of the Second Step program, the middle school teachers are helping students build positive relationships, counteract bullying behavior, and set goals so they can flourish in life."










Tuscarora Elementary Short Story Publishing Party

When asked what inspires her to be in her field, she said, "I take on any challenge that I am


given" and "It was a good change." She also highlighted the most important part of her job: being accurate, confidential and compassionate.

Come Visit the MS/HS Library!


We've made a crime scene in the library! Thanks, Officer Brad Fuerst, for the caution tape! Students are encouraged to examine the clues



Upcoming Winter Weather Season

Although we hope for no inclement weather, we live in New York and that is not going to happen. Bus safety is a critical component to overall school safety as our busses and bus drivers are on the road daily transporting students to and from school, traveling to out of district placements, as well as to extra-curricular/athletic events in the evening. As you know, delaying or closing school is a challenging decision to make. We use all information available (at the time) to make "the call". We frequently communicate with the county and town and village highway departments to ensure we are making an appropriate decision. With all of this said, below is a brief summary of the various places to access delay/cancelation information, in logical order to do so:

<u>School Closings/Delays/Cancelations:</u>

- 1. Go to the school district web site: Addisoncsd.org we will announce it there <u>first</u> with our on-screen alert (pop up message) on the home page. This is probably the easiest and quickest way to find out any information.
- 2. Go to the Addison District Facebook page.
- 3. Watch the local TV news and/or listen to the local radio stations—not always the fastest way to find out this information.
- 4. Wait for a call from our automated dialer system.

Note that in most cases, the call will be made before 6AM on the morning of the weather event. If the weather is severe enough, we will try to call off school the *night before*. We will follow the same protocol as above.

Canceling After School and/or Evening Events:

On the occasion where we have to cancel an after school or evening activity and/or athletic event, we will work to make a decision (as soon as possible) and follow the steps above for cancelations.

<u>Please note #1</u> - There is never the "right" time of day to make any of these decisions. Much of the decision will be dictated by weather patterns, forecasting possible future weather events, and the advice from those places that we may be travelling to; **This** is ALL in the name of safety for everyone!

<u>Please note #2</u> – None of us went to school to be meteorologists, but we pledge to do the best we can with the information that is made available to us at the time, always erring on the side of caution. Remember, there is a delicate balancing act between needing to provide an education (and other related school services and activities) for our students and the monitoring of weather conditions that are inevitable this time of year!

<u>Please note #3</u> - The *variations in the weather*, along with changing road conditions, can be very different from school district to school district and even within our own district.

<u>Please Note #4</u> - The use of a remote day or two (in late winter/early spring) is always a possibility if we have a challenging winter weather season!

In the event that we have to close school early after everyone is already here on campus, the District will follow our emergency go home early procedures established by your school building or department.
