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

Mr. Lyke grew up and went to school in Savona, NY. He originally wanted to be a broadcaster for the Buffalo Bills and even chose to major in broadcasting at SUNY Oswego. Listening to Don Imus and Howard Stern and having a good friend who worked in radio inspired him to pursue this field. He ended up working in radio for 12 years. After this job, Mr. Lyke went to the Arc of Steuben where he worked with people that had developmental disabilities.

Mr. Lyke coached his daughter's soccer team when she was little. During that time, parents would tell him that he was great with kids. Also, they often asked him why he wasn't a teacher. Ironically, he always wanted to be a teacher, but he thought he had missed his chance. He was encouraged and decided to pursue a master's degree in education at Elmira College.

In 2008, Mr. Lyke began working at the Tuscarora Elementary School as a 4th grade teacher. Mr. Lyke says, "My favorite memory of teaching is when I have taught a lesson, a student is struggling and then after a reteach, the lightbulb goes off and they get the lesson. I love when that happens. I will always remember when I was awarded the teacher of the year with several of my colleagues in 2019."

Though he had hoped to be a teacher for 20 years, his physical needs have made it hard for him to continue his career. It is with mixed emotions that he is retiring. He expressed how he has worked with very talented teachers and how he has developed good friendships. He hopes to continue to share memories with them outside of work. Mr. Lyke says all three jobs he's had have helped him grow as a person and he's very fond of being able to experience all of them.

After retirement, Mr. Lyke hopes to travel, spend as much time with his daughter and go to Bills games for as long as he can. He hopes to have made an impact on the lives of the students who were in his class.

Mr. Lyke has a special message for the community: "I want the community to know that I gave it my all. I really cared about the students in my class and hope they value their education and do their best every day. My mother would say, 'If you have done your best, that is all I can ask of you.' My challenge with my disability has been tough." He's very excited for what the next chapter will bring and hopes everyone knows he gave 100%.

We thank him for everything he's done for the students as well as the community and wish him luck and good memories during retirement.
