By completing this application, you have decided to apply for the Peer Leader Program!

A Peer Leader is a positive role model for peers that helps create a safe, respectful, and welcoming school environment. As a Peer Leader, you would help to support the 6<sup>th</sup> grade students.

Peer Leaders will have multiple responsibilities at Addison Middle School, including:

- "Meet and Greet"-help with orientation for new students in the middle school by giving tours, assisting with lockers and helping students who are new to the middle school feel welcome.
- Promote messages of respect and reinforcing middle school expectations.
- Mentoring a small group of 6<sup>th</sup> grade students throughout the school year.

We would love to have all students who wish to participate, become Peer Leaders, however spaces are limited. We will form a review committee that will select a number of candidates after reviewing paper applications.

#### **Peer Leader Time Commitment**

Peer Leaders are expected to attend "Lunch with the Leader" each month. This takes place during the students assigned lunch period and consists of a meeting with the Peer Leader Advisor to discuss upcoming events, questions and concerns. In addition, Peer Leaders are also expected to help in scheduled activities, such as the following:

- Summer Team Building and Leadership Retreat (1-2 days)
- 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Career Day
- Kindness Week

#### Peer Leader Eligibility Requirements

- 1. Attend all Peer Leader meetings. If you are unable to attend a meeting, you need to see the advisor prior to or after the meeting.
- 2. Attend the Summer Team Building and Leadership Retreat.
- 3. Display positive behavior in the school and in the community.
- 4. Maintain a passing average in all classes.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your student has elected to apply for a position as a Middle School Peer Leader for the 2017-18 school year. I would like to explain the different aspects of this program and the commitment it will involve from your student.

The primary work of students in the group will be to serve as leaders among the student body. Peer Leaders will serve as mentors to 6<sup>th</sup> grade students and each Peer Leader will be assigned a group of students to mentor throughout the school year.
