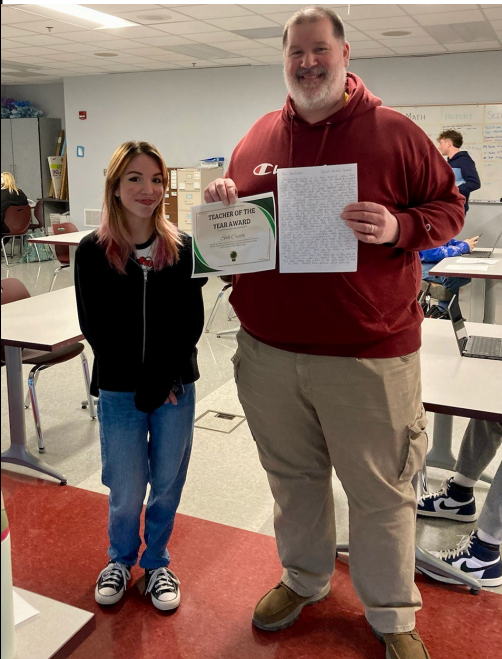

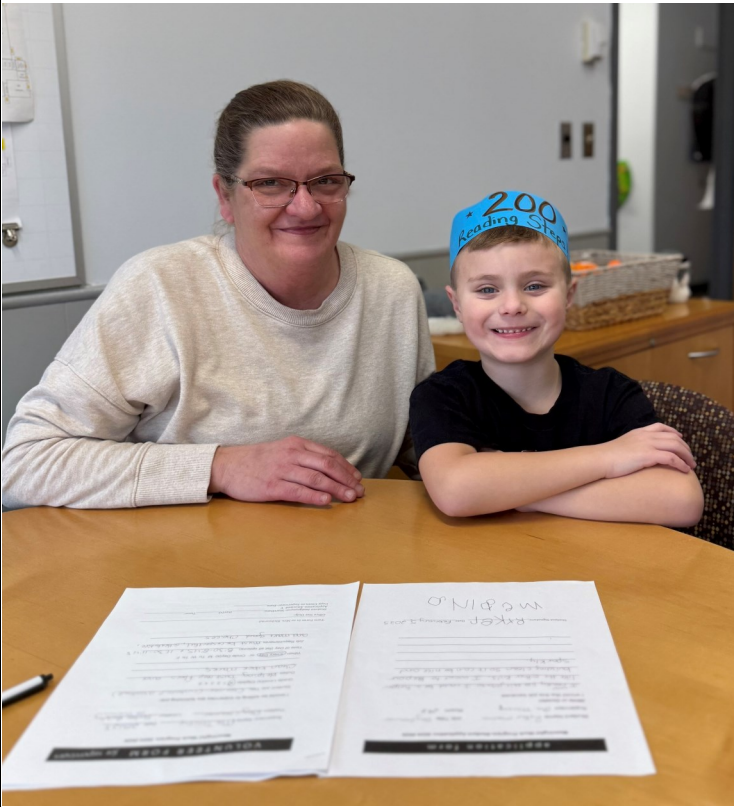
Riders to Readers at Tuscarora

Mr. Cansdale Makes It Happen

At the end of Unit 6: Classical Europe, the freshman were tasked to showcase their understanding in a non-conventional way. For this project, 9th grade students were asked to construct physical models representing key architectural elements of the Roman Empire. The students were assessed on the development and enduring legacy of classical civilizations and through designing a representation of Roman legacy. This allowed for increased long-term understanding, rather than memorization. With rigorous tasks and research, the students were able to create impressive models of the Colosseum, aqueducts, villas, road systems, army camps and pieces of the Roman forum.

Through this experimental approach, students not only reinforced historical content but also honed research, design, and problem-solving abilities, making history more relatable and engaging.
