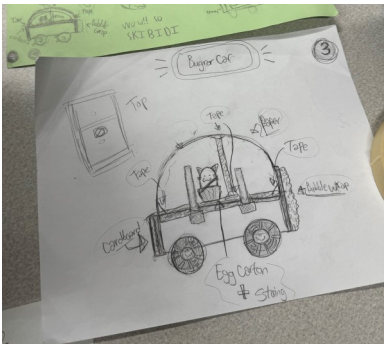


Middle School Happenings

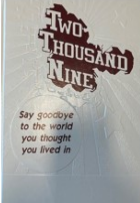
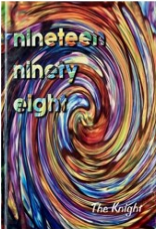
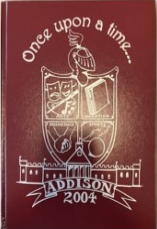
Do You recognize any of these covers?

Requesting Official Transcripts from CCC

Seniors who have taken Accelerated College Education (ACE) courses will need to request their transcript directly from Corning Community College. School Counselors do not have access to official college transcripts. Students can use the following link to request an official copy of their CCC transcript to be sent to the college they plan to attend: <https://www.corning-cc.edu/admissions-future-students/ace/transcript-requests.php>.

Some important notes:

- Students will need their CCC ID or Social Security number. ACE teachers can look up CCC IDs on their rosters for the student.
- Cost is \$8.00
- Please select "Wait for Final Grades" when making your request. If not, you will need to purchase another transcript when all grades are entered.
