

Brenna, a Dirt Bike Champion





Brenna started riding on a strider bike when she was only one. She would ride around her backyard and hit her jumps. Eventually, she had her first race at the age of 3. Brenna then started racing on a pedal bike a little before her 4th birthday and has been racing ever since. Brenna is 9 now and is very accomplished for her age. She has raced in 18 different states and 49 different tracks all over the country, including New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, New Jersey, Oklahoma, Missouri, Louisiana, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Indiana, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, Michigan, Delaware, Connecticut, and Massachusetts. Brenna races 2 bikes: a class bike with 20" wheels and a cruiser bike with 24" wheels.



Brenna has a few accolades to boast about; she is a 3x NAG place finisher (National Age Group). She is also a 2x Northeast regional gold cup champ, 2x New York State Champ, and a 4x District Top 10 place finisher. She is currently sitting 7th in class and 5th for cruiser for NAG points (National Age group 9 girls). For National points on her class bike, she is ranked 66 and for cruiser she is ranked 38th. National points are for all the women any age that race.

She recently competed at worlds and she finished with an impressive 14th place. The race was held in South Carolina. There were 9 countries and her age group had 50 girls in it. Brenna certainly has a bright future ahead of her.
