A Warm Welcome to Ms. Carleton: 10th grade ELA teacher

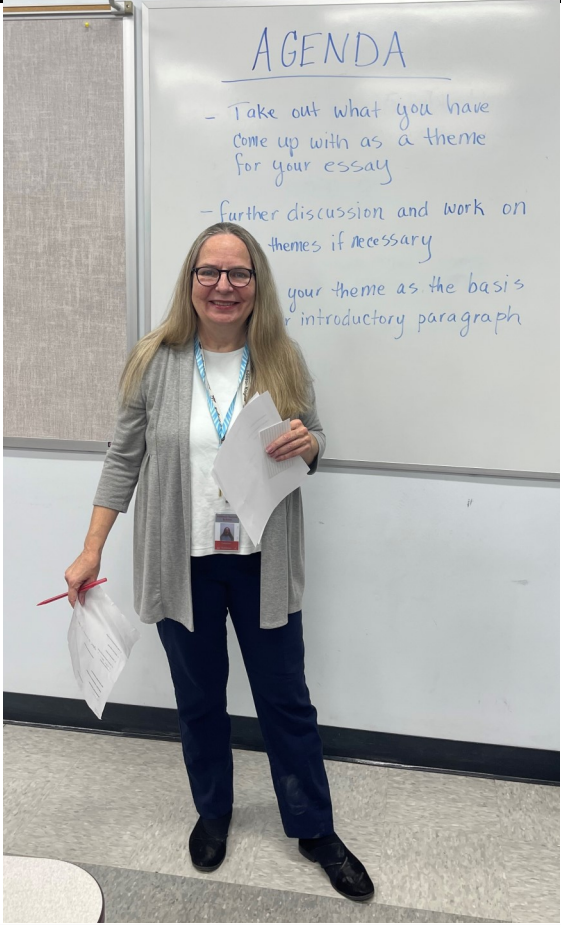

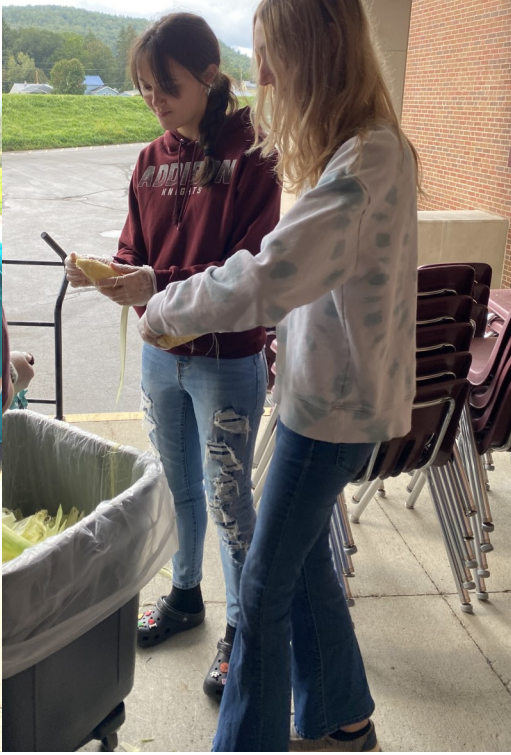
