For any new teachers, Mrs. Gardner has a word of advice: "Form positive relationships, nurture those relationships, show the students you genuinely care....it will make the world of difference for all involved."

Easton S. said, "Uh, fine." When asked what his favorite class is, he said, "Social Studies."




