President Sutton called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and led the group in <u>To Order</u> the Pledge of Allegiance after explaining the emergency procedure.

The President turned the recognitions over to the Superintendent who asked Mr. Howe, to explain the first award given. The award, Academic All-Star, was given to Marlee Pradichith (who was unable to attend). Marlee received this award for her hardworking, self driven to excellence traits, and for her achievement in Academic All Stars. Mr. Howe also said that she has been accepted into the Higher Education Opportunity Program at Ithaca College. She received \$100. from the committee.

Middle School Principal, Tanya Loomis then asked Mr. Tim Gates and Mrs. Lori Krelie to come forward to be recognized for putting forth the effort and receiving the ARTS council grants. This is the second year for receiving these grants;. Dinosaurs Walking Among Us, for \$2,809 and the other grant is Project Western Door for \$3,234. The grants incorporates Art, Music, Literature and History and focuses on the Seneca Iroquois nation. Mrs. Krelie has taken field trips with the students to the museum in Salamanca which allows the students to look firsthand at history. She also has made it possible to have native Americans visit the school. Each teacher was presented with a recognition certificate.

Mrs. Stiker then proceeded to explain the next award which was the Don and Marion White award given by their son Ronald White in their memory. She asked Mrs. Loomis to explain this award and its background. Mrs. Loomis stated the award given was a citizenship award and was to go to two 6th. grade students who had over 95 academic average and was designated as good citizens. This year the awards went to Michaela Setzer and Luke Woodard, receiving a \$200. savings bond and a Good Citizenship certificate. This award has been given each year for 15 years and this year Mr. White asked that an award be given to a teacher who models the qualities of a good citizen also, and this award was given to Mr. Dave Clark, Elementary Art teacher. All three received recognition certificates from the Board of Education.

Recognitions

At this time, Mrs. Stiker asked Mr. White to come forward also. She gave some further background regarding the awards in honor of his parents, as well as noting that he also was a graduate of our school. She then presented him with a certificate of appreciation for his continued thoughtfulness and dedication to the community and school.

Recognitions

The Superintendent began explaining the role of a School Resource Officer. and asked Officer David Cole to come forward to be recognized. She stated that he is volunteering his time to the District as the SRO. The Village and the School share the cost of his fuel to the job site only. Each of the Principals acknowledged their appreciation to Officer Cole for all his work in the school and noted that at the elementary school he has become a "celebrity" to the students. Mrs. Flint and Mrs. Loomis reported that he visits some of the classrooms and is always visible in the school and takes the time to talk with the students as much as possible. At the high school, Mr. Howe stated that discipline has been reduced significantly since he has been in the school. He is always available to students, whether it is just to say hi or is handling a situation. Mr. Howe also said he has gained the respect of the students and staff and that our District is very fortunate that he is willing to volunteer his services to us and he has definitely made a difference in just the short time he has been in the schools. Mrs. Stiker thanked Officer Cole for his work and on behalf of the community and school are grateful for his desire to volunteer his time in our District.

Office Cole then thanked everyone for the recognition and said he enjoys the interaction with the staff and students and has much respect for the community and District as well.

At this time, President Sutton asked that the Board have an Executive Session after agenda item #10 and stated there would be action taken when returning to Regular Session. A motion was made by Trustee Stuart and seconded by Trustee Terwilliger to approve the agenda as amended. Motion carried.

Mrs. Stiker then reviewed the following correspondence: Information regarding the NYSSBA Conference October 15-18, 2009 in NYC; Legislative information; and the Area 3 newsletter.

Correspondence

During the Superintendent's report, Mrs. Stiker passed around to the Board, a sample of the new cafeteria trays, which have a picture of the "Knight" on them and are maroon in color. Very impressive. She stated that she and President Sutton had attended the Valedictorian/Salutatorian dinner at the Radisson Hotel on June 18th; she reported that the Title 1 Grant monies had been reduced by \$9,315 for the year; the BAN note was sold at 2.18% rate; and stated that she and Mr. Howe had a 3 hour conference call with Cannon Design regarding project signage for all signs to be in the school.

Superintendent's Report

Trustee Peoples reported that he had attended the annual (BAM) Brooke Ann Makowiec softball tournament on Saturday and Sunday. Despite the rain, the tournament was well attended.

Board Reports

President Sutton reported that the Policy committee and the Superintendent's Evaluation committees had met and that items resulting from these meetings were on the agenda for approval.

During the Public Session, Mrs. Weale was recognized by President Sutton. She requested copy of the personnel items, resignations, appointments that the Board would be approving. Other concerns were, the cost of the Cupola repair, where the new Board Room was going to be, and again mentioned a PA system. Construction Manager, Barry Church, replied that the cost of the Cupola was in the project listed at \$100,000 or less and hopefully would be completed in the fall. Mr. Church and Mrs. Stiker reiterated again that a new Board Room is not in the project, meetings would still be held in the cafeteria and at the other 2 schools as previously done in the past.

Public Forum

Discussion was held by the Board regarding an annual Board retreat. When, where, and any topics they might want to cover. It was agreed that the retreat would be held at the District Office Monday and Tuesday evenings, August 17th and 18th, from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. and an outside facilitator would not be used this year. They agreed that one of the evenings should be reviewing the Board handbook. Mrs. Stiker asked that other topics of interest be directed to the Clerk as soon as possible. The Superintendent also handed out the calendar of Board meetings for the 2009-2010 school year.
