

When her mother retired and closed the shop, she went off to work for a Corning florist. After eight months of being unhappy with this job, she stumbled across an ad for new floral equipment. This prompted her to open her own flower shop right on Main Street in Addison called English Gardens: "I loved what I did."

Even though she loved being a florist, she didn't have a lot of time for her family. She decided to sell her beloved shop and become a substitute teacher in the Addison School District. After subbing for three years and working almost every day, a co-worker suggested that she apply to be a teaching assistant. She has now been a

Addison District Families - As you are likely aware, the District has already used three (3) emergency closure days this year.

What does this mean for the students and their families as we navigate through the remaining school year?

It means that the next emergency closing/snow day WILL BE REMOTE as long as we know the school day before to prepare staff, students, and families/ caregivers. Proceeding in this way will avoid the possibility of having to reclaim days from our remaining school breaks in February and April while also allowing us to preserve the possibility of having two (2) days remaining at or near the end of the school year to flex as needed.

The general idea is that a pivot to remote learning is a "regular" school day in the sense that all students will be learning, all teachers will be teaching, and all support staff will be working/learning.

The students will be <u>learning at home</u> and the teachers will be teaching at home (or teaching from their classrooms/school building). Each Program Level Principal will be communicating building level details regarding how the remote learning day for students will look and the expectations for participation. Additional information about technology support on remote days will be forth-


coming.

Please Note: The idea here is to make the remote learning experience as "regular" of a learning day as possible. This will be a continuous work in progress with expected small bumps along the way while knowing that it will be OK. Be on the lookout for communications from your child's Principal.
