Behind the Scenes: The Student Masterminds of the Addison Post Newsletter

The Addison High School Journalism class has completed 19 student-led editions at this time. These typically vary from interviews on new or old staff members to activities going on in the schools within the district as well as community events that involve the students. The class has students in grades 10-12 and is led by two teachers, Mrs. Clark and Mrs. Ferratella. The course is designed for students to share their knowledge while learning about the community, to take ownership over reporting important events and to give students power over sharing news with the Addison community.

When asked about some of their favorite parts of the Journalism class, the students said that it's never boring as they always have something new to be working on! They also enjoy how creative they can be with what they cover, and how to layout the news. Class time is spent on gathering news and writing articles. Class periods are spent on brainstorming articles ideas for the next edition, writing copy and then editing. Time during class is sometimes spent writing emails to administrators and investigating what they should cover in the next edition, fact-checking and taking, choosing and editing pictures that coincide with the articles. Often, much time needs to be spent on formatting the editions and making sure it's ready for publication.

Mrs. Clark and Mrs. Ferratella hope to teach Journalism next year and would like to have even more student involvement. They encourage all students to branch out and give it a try. Going forward, they would like to see a common place for all people to be involved in sharing the news.

Some benefits of the Journalism class are that it can be a full or half year course. Students can take it for half the year and get a half credit or stay in all year and get a full year's credit. It also helps students build their portfolios and have a publication added to their resumes. It encourages collaboration amongst peers, and working together on a common product. It involves a comfortable learning environment where students encourage and support each other. Some students also comment that Journalism class has helped their skills in their core English class!


Newest National Honor Society Inductees


Spring Sports Excitement
