Mrs. Flint is Retiring

Mrs. Flint has worked in the school district for over 30 years. She knew from the moment she was a little girl that she wanted to be a teacher. It was her dream job. Mrs. Flint had teachers she loved along the way and thought to herself, “This is exactly what I want to do.” She played school all the time when she was growing up; her parents even bought her a chalkboard, a pointer with the little rubber tip, the red/blue teacher pens, and a lesson plan book. She thought, “These are the greatest tools to become a teacher.” As she looks back now, she can’t help but laugh because skills, trainings, and tools teachers have today are so out of this world compared to back then. She was influenced to become a teacher because she simply loved going to school, had wonderful elementary teachers, and was involved in clubs, organizations, volunteering, and school spirit projects throughout her years in elementary, junior high, and high school. She has had many jobs along the way, volunteering her HS years in a kindergarten classroom, and taught Sunday School for English Language Learners. She was a cashier, a waitress, golf and bar manager, planner for events all while she was going to school and during her first few years of teaching.

Mrs. Flint started with her associates degree in Early Childhood, then transferred to Cortland State for her bachelor’s degree. She did her student teaching in Corning and landed her first job in Addison. She went to Elmira College for her master’s and then achieved her administrative degree at Brockport. Mrs. Flint has spent her entire career in the Addison Central School District. In her beginning years (1984) she was a first-grade teacher at the Valley Elementary School, which she absolutely loved. She then moved (1990) to Tuscarora School. She was a teacher for 16 years and then became an administrator in January 2000. Then in 2004, Mrs. Flint became the Valley and Tuscarora School principal. She was very instrumental in the realignment of the Valley Early Childhood Preschool Programs when numbers were declining there. What better way to keep the beautiful Valley School open than to push for an all early childhood program (both school and outside agency).

Mrs. Flint retired from Addison School District in 2016, moving onto to Career Development Council Coordinator through GST BOCES to have a little part-time job and stay connected with the students, families, and community. She was a little afraid to stop working after spending so many years in education and it was a win-win for her to have her second career also with Addison Central Schools. She already knew the students, the families, and the staff. Mrs. Flint’s new role was to offer career opportunities at all levels K-12 through interviews, shadows, classroom presentations, speakers, field trips, and panels.

Mrs. Flint is excited to slow down a little bit, but she will stay connected in education as the Alfred University - Corning Program Coordinator pursuing students after their associate degree to stay in Corning at CCC and become an Alfred University student in both psychology and education, and then onward for their masters in literacy or special education. Her favorite job she has been (obviously) loving anything that has to do with children/students. Mrs. Flint thinks it is because she enjoys seeing students grow, develop, learn, and find their niche. Mrs. Flint loves watching the years of a young child evolve into become a young adult and seeing the learning along the way. She has had the pleasure of seeing this for two generations of students throughout her time in Addison.
