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Tuscarora Open House



100 STEP READING CHALLENGE Home Coach Contract

Dear Tuscarora Families,

Student's Name

This week we are kicking off our 100 Step Reading Challenge! Your student will be doing lots of reading in school and at home. The reason for this program is simple: Research shows that students who read for one hour every day, from books they can read and want to read, have a much better chance for success in school and beyond. The more time your child spends reading at his or her independent level, the better reader he or she will become!

We need your help Tuscarora families! Every week your student will bring home books and a reading log. Your student should read for at least 30 minutes per night. When she or he does, she/he will fill in a line (or more than one line-depending on how many minutes read and how much needs to be written, you can use more than one line per day) on the reading log, and you should sign it.

We encourage our families to use this time to sit with your child as the Home Reading Coach. The reading should be easy and fun for your child. It should not be a struggle. Please complete and return the bottom portion of this form to let us know you agree to partner in your child's reading and academic success as their Home Reading Coach.

As the Home Reading Coach, we ask that you:

- Turn off TV, computers, phone, and games
- Observe your child reading for at least 30 minutes
 Think and talk elegate the least 90 minutes
- Think and talk about the book afterward
