Addison Sports updates:

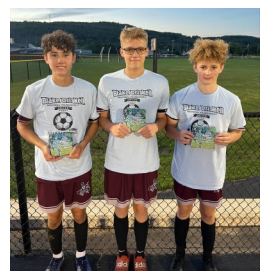
Volleyball:

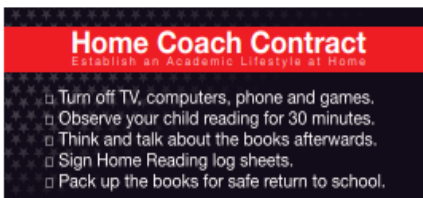


100 Step Reading Challenge at Tuscarora Elementary School



★ Here's What You Need To Know: ★

- You are your student's Home Reading Coach. Please review the Home Coach Contract (at right) for guidelines as you help your student be the best reader he/she can be.
- Please partner with us by ensuring that your student reads two steps (30 minutes) at home each night. Read-alouds count!
- Please assist your student in completing his/her daily reading. We ask that you sign the log to validate reading activity each night. Feel free to make your validation fun by using stickers or signing with stars.

100 STEP READING CHALLENGE Home Coach Contract

Dear Tuscarora Families,

This week we are kicking off our 100 Step Reading Challenge! Your student will be doing lots of reading in school and at home. The reason for this program is simple: Research shows that students who read for one hour every day, from books they can read and want to read, have a much better chance for success in school and beyond. The more time your child spends reading at his or her independent level, the better reader he or she will become!

We need your help Tuscarora families! Every week your student will bring home books and a reading log. Your student should read for at least 30 minutes per night. When she or he does, she/he will fill in a line (or more than one line depending on how many minutes read and how much needs to be written, you can use more than one line per day) on the reading log, and you should sign it.

We encourage our families to use this time to sit with your child as the Home Reading Coach. The reading should be easy and fun for your child. It should not be a struggle. Please complete and return the bottom portion of this form to let us know you agree to partner in your child's reading and academic success as their Home Reading Coach.

As the Home Reading Coach, we ask that you:

- Turn off TV, computers, phone, and games
- Observe your child reading for at least 30 minutes
- Think and talk about the book afterward
- Sign your child's 100 Step Reading Challenge log
- Help your child pack up their books for safe return to school

Yes! I agree to be the Home Reading Coach for my child! I will make sure she or he reads every night at home for 30 minutes. I will provide 30 minutes of protected quiet time with no TV, no computer, no phone and no games every day. I will talk with my child about the books they are reading. I will sign the reading only when I have actually observed them reading. I will make sure all the books and materials are returned safely to school at the end of every week.

LIFTING THE COMMUNITY

1 What is it?
The Lift Project is an evidence-based well-being program that uniquely brings together scientifically-proven strategies drawn from research in the fields of Neuroscience, Lifestyle Medicine, and Positive Psychology.

Presented by internationally recognized well-being expert, Dr. Darren Morton, The Lift Project experientially explores 7 well-being-enhancing topics over 7 weeks that are designed to give individuals, groups, and organizations a lift.

2 How does it work?
The Lift Project is delivered through an online learning platform, which you will have access to through June 30th, 2023. You will receive an email each week from 'The Lift Project' giving you access to the weekly lesson. Each lesson takes about 15 minutes to complete online. You will also gain access to The Lift Project Workbook which offers follow-up experiences, journaling prompts, and much more for each of the 7 lessons.

3 When will it happen?
The challenge begins October 3rd and runs through November 18th. However, you will have access to the lessons through June 30, 2023.


