Spotlight: Administration



All Addison Central School District staff came together on September 4th to kick off the new school year and hear a powerful message about the importance of educators. The day's events began with a welcome from Board of Education President Michelle Terwilliger. The District's Great Place to Work team introduced new staff members and Superintendent Joe DioGuardi announced staff longevity recognitions and shared his goals for the new school year with the staff. Union leaders also welcomed staff to the start of a new year.

The keynote speaker was #1 New York Times Best Seller List and #1 International Best Selling Author Dave Pelzer. He is the author of eight inspirational books. Pelzer's first book, *A Child Called "It"*, has been on the *New York Times* Best Sellers List for more than six years and his books have been on the same Best Sellers List approaching 13 years combined. As an author, Pelzer is the first to have four #1 International Best Sellers and to have four books simultaneously on the *New York Times* Best Sellers List.

Pelzer has experienced a truly extraordinary life. As a young boy, he nearly died several times by the hands of his mentally unstable, alcoholic mother. At age 12, he was rescued and placed in a series of foster homes. "I know for a fact that I would be dead today if it wasn't for my teachers," said Pelzer, upon recounting stories of school personnel helping him during his worst times and alerting authorities to his situation at home. "Your ran-

dom acts of kindness, generosity and unconditional love – you have no idea of the impact they have on your students. To you, it's just something you do, but to them, it could be everything."

Pelzer enlisted in the U.S. Air Force at age 18. As a former Air Force Combat Air Crew Member, his job entailed midair refueling of the once highly-secretive SR-71 Blackbird and the F-117 Stealth Fighter. While on active duty, Pelzer was selected as California Volunteer of the Year. He has received personal commendations from four U.S. Presidents. He was honored as one of the Ten Outstanding Young Americans, and later, was the only American to be honored as The Outstanding Young Person of the World. Pelzer is also the recipient of the National Jefferson Award, which is considered to be the Pulitzer Prize for public service.

"We invited Dave to be our keynote speaker because his story and message align with our overall district plan for the year, which is to focus on educating the whole child," said Superintendent Joe DioGuardi. "It is critical that we, as a school community, recognize that educating our students includes more than traditional reading, writing and arithmetic. We need to provide support and services to meet all of our students' different needs."

After the keynote, staff took part in workshops on topics related to educating the whole child, including Conscious Discipline, Safety and Security and Resilience and Adverse Childhood Experiences.




