sented the Veterans with gifts of appreciation for helping our country stay safe and free.








**Tuscarora Elementary School : Letters to Vets**

#### Performance-Based Assessments:

Fourth grade students from Mrs. Shipman and Mr. Lyke's classes made terrariums for a science project. Students are learning about what an environment is.
